1. ## Information to Parents

Tees & Hartlepool Yacht Club aim to provide a safe & enjoyable experience for all who take part in boating activities at the club. To help us provide a quality service please note the following important information.

- All cadets taking part must hand in a fully completed consent form before being allowed on the water
- Parents/guardians must ensure that they make their own arrangements for children going to and leaving the session as THYC volunteers cannot be responsible for children outside of the session time.
- It is a THYC requirement that all children of primary school age **MUST** have a parent/guardian on site during the session.
- Any cadet under the age of 16 attending the session but not taking part **MUST** have a parent/guardian on site during the session.
- Appropriate equipment must be worn & can be provided by the club. A wetsuit & buoyancy aid will be provided at the beginning of each session if required - ***this equipment must be worn for the duration of the activity.***
- Please ensure your child has old shoes which will get wet, sun screen, shoes to change into afterwards, a towel & warm clothing.
- THYC cannot be responsible for lost or damaged property. We therefore advise you to discourage your child from bringing valuable items.
